Greystone presents new honor code

Academy students, staff hold official ceremony

The 2010 Greystone class at Schreiner University presented its new Honor Code and Standards of Conduct at a ceremony at the Union Church Building on Nov. 16, and after explanations of the code were given and audience questions answered, all 28 class members signed both documents.

County Judge Pat Tinley was the invited leader for the presentation.

"The students developed these codes and standards so they will deserve to be the leaders they aspire to be," Tinley told the audience. "When they are done with their presentation, you, the public, can ask them how the code applies to hypothetical situations. These things will have to become so ingrained, they can use them even when there's no time to ponder."

Greystone Cadet Kevin Sampson of Oregon was chairman of the Honor Code committee and presented the new code to the audience.

The new Greystone Honor Code reads:

"As Greystone students, we will not lie, cheat or steal nor tolerate those who do.

We will be tenacious and proactive in our vigilance to preserve our Code, which will ensure that our Honor remains 'top of mind' in all that we do. All Greystoners will establish and maintain an upright

moral compass by:

- Abiding by the absolute truth with no intention to deceive or conceal any information – the Honor Code prohibits lying.

- Upholding complete fairness in every action with no intention of gaining an unfair advantage – the Honor Code prohibits cheating.

- Respecting the person and property of others – the Honor Code prohibits stealing.

We are obligated to take immediate action upon observation of a perceived honor violation, which will prevent our fellow Greystoners from engaging in an

honor violation; failing to do so will be considered toleration."

Sampson told the audience that concealing the truth equals lying, under this code.

"Crossing the line of toleration is what upholds this code, the line between truth, fairness and respect; and lying, cheating and stealing. The Honor Code should

always be top of mind," he said.

An audience member asked what the punishment is if a Greystoner is caught in a violation.

Sampson said the class's investigating officer, Keyawna Danai of Nevada, checks the violation, and it's voted on by the class to decide
